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

Instructional Strategies of the Week

Our campus will begin a new **Fundamental 5** Instructional Strategy of "Small Group Purposeful Talks (SGPT)" and the <u>Playbook Focus</u> will the and "Exit Tickets" Students learn the instructional content better if SGPTs are after 10-15 minutes of teacher talk and followed by 3-5 minutes of student talk that is planned and posted for students. A way to help students gain understanding of content objectives and an informal check for understanding using EXIT TICKETS.

<u>Fundamental 5</u>

Small Group Purposeful Talks

- Is the practice of having planned, content based discussion between 2-4 students following every 10-15 minutes of teacherdriven discussion.
- Helps students process the information from the lesson.
- Allows students to discover and engage with a range of perspectives, ideas and backgrounds

Playbook Focus

Exit ticket

- Provide a question or topic related to the learning objective.
- Provide students with a sentence stem to help structure written responses (include academic vocabulary_
- Collaborate with your team for expectation of responses to inform next steps
- Provide an opportunity for students to get feedback on the responses.


