The Fundamental 5 Wharton Elementary School "Teacher of the Week" is Ms. Krystal Mathis for the week of August 14th-18th. Ms. Mathis is a 3rd grade reading teacher. She has been teaching reading at Wharton Elementary for 3 years. Ms. Mathis has 2 children, a daughter and a son. Her daughter, Hailey is 15 and her son Anthony, is 14. Ms. Mathis loves listening to country music and supporting her children during rodeo events on the weekends. She truly enjoys working at Wharton ISD and being able to help her students grow and be successful.

Ms. Mathis's highlight this week was her effectiveness of "Framing the Lesson", using the "Randomization" instructional strategies.

Ms. Mathis states the lesson objective at the beginning of each lesson, posts the objective on the board in friendly student language and refers back to and restates the lesson objective throughout her lessons. She incorporates the randomization strategy in all of her lessons as well. She uses popsicle sticks or Class Dojo to randomly choose students to answer questions throughout the lesson. Ms. Mathis is an asset to Wharton Elementary and students are lucky to have her as their teacher!

- Provide students with the opportunity to give feedback of their learning





The procedure is to use your classroom phone to call the front office (Mrs. Horelica) and let her know you are needing an administrator. She will contact the administrator and the administrator will go to the classroom to get the student.
- Please don't raise your voice at students in the classroom or anywhere on the campus. We are to use PAX and PBIS strategies to get students' attention. Please refer to students as "FRIENDS". If we are to expect respect from them, we need to show them respect as well. Our relationships with students are directly correlated with student performance and success. The more positive interactions we have with them, the better they will feel about themselves, which will result in students "Doing the Work" to be a better student.
- <u>Transitions</u> Teachers are to be out in the hallways and by their doors during all class transitions. When students enter your classroom, please greet each one positively. This is a GREAT time to assess the students' current mood. If you notice something isn't quite right, this is the perfect time to pull the student to the side and find out what is going on. This is a proactive way to defuse a possible negative behavior that could occur.
- Ensure you are incorporating the Framing the Lesson and Exit Tickets in all of your lessons.
- <u>Security Measures</u> Please make sure your classroom door and outside doors are closed and locked at all times.
- <u>Morning Procedure</u>- Please make sure you are in the gym at **7:27** every morning to pick up your students and escort them to your classroom.
